CAMBRIDGE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT is one of the UK's best equipped regional airports being part of the Marshall Group of Companies, a privately owned family business founded in 1909. Situated just 3 miles from the centre of Europe's leading University City and at the heart of the East of England, central to Cambridgeshire, Suffolk, Peterborough, East Anglia and the south eastern Midlands region.

Often referred to as the UK's Silicon Valley, the Airport is within short commute of major towns and cities and the UK's leading scientific R&D economy fronted by academic, medical, science and technology, clean-tech, research investment and development, engineering, agriculture and high capacity production sectors.

Its runway can accept aircraft up to the size of a Boeing 757 or Airbus 320, all regional jet types, and has all the air traffic controls and navigational aids necessary to make it suitable for both short- and medium-haul passenger airline services.

The fully refurbished terminal offers passengers an excellent and friendly customer experience including short check-in times, speedy security processes with no queues, Costa Coffee and complimentary Wi-Fi, offering spacious departure and VIP lounge accommodating up to 150 passengers.

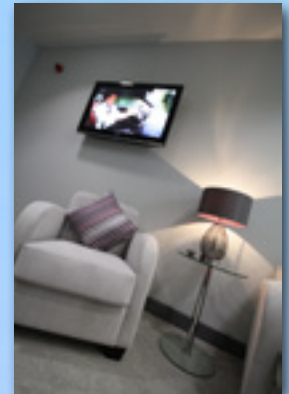
The airport is currently experiencing growth in the Passenger airline and Executive Jet sectors and recent new airline and tour operator services including the UK, the Channel Islands and destinations within Europe.

GETTING THERE

Cambridge International Airport is located only three miles from Cambridge City Centre and is close to all major road networks and being 14 miles from Newmarket, the historical home of horse racing, allows it to support the racing and bloodstock trades. It is easily accessible from regional centres, with cities such as Peterborough and Ipswich within an hour's drive of the airport; while Canary Wharf and East London are under an hour's drive away. The airport also has good public transport links and can be easily accessed by rail. Cambridge station is a 45-minute train ride from Kings Cross, London, then it's just 15 minutes by taxi from the station to the terminal.

Airport Lynx, the airport's official transfers operator, offers an airport bus shuttle between the

airport and any point in Cambridge City Centre and surrounding areas. Pick-ups and drop-offs take place in their geographical order, with the rail station taking priority for those with trains to catch. Alternatively, reliable, on-demand or pre-bookable taxi services are available through Airport Lynx, which has its own desk in the arrivals hall.
